PROPAGANDA BROADCASTS

It is the purpose of this bulletin to outline matters of interest to next of kin of personnel mentioned in propaganda broadcasts of opposing forces.

MAIL

The Department of Defense has received information that your relative has been reported as a prisoner of war in propaganda broadcasts by the Korean or Chinese Communists. These reports do not constitute official confirmation by the United States that your relative is a prisoner of war, and no guarantee can be given that attempts by you to communicate with your relative will be successful; however, arrangements have been made with the U.S. Post Office so that you may address mail to him. At present letters should not be too long, and only one letter per month should be forwarded. Address your letter as follows:

Grade, name, and service number of your relative  
c/o Chinese People's Committee for World Peace  
Peking, China

Place your letter in an envelope addressed as shown above. No postage is necessary. In the upper right corner of the envelope write the words "Prisoner of War Mail", and in the upper left corner the return address. See example below:

Drop your letter into any U.S. mail box.
