Duties of Elector receiving a Soldier's Vote.

Exerct from Section 5 of Chapter 253 Laws of 1864.

Section 5. Such elector, upon receiving such letter from such absent elector, may open the outer envelope thereof, but he shall not open the inner envelope thereof. On the day of such election, and between the pening and close of the period ereof, he shall delignment envelope to the ectors of elections of the proper election district, and at the polls thereof.
